

2023 Tree Sale Species Information List EVERGREENS TREES Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziensii*) A native to the Pacific Northwest, the Douglas Fir can get very large and live a long time in its native range. Here in the Midwest, the Douglas Fir can reach 100 ft., half the size it can reach in the Northwest. This tree makes a wonderful Christmas tree so plant several and in a few years you can harvest your own! Norway Spruce (Picea abies) Norway spruce is a familiar sight in much of the United States, but it's really a tree of Europe. Throughout the globe, this tree has many uses including lumber, pulpwood, Christmas trees and landscape specimen trees. Its dense branching pattern and tolerance of soil variations has also made it a popular tree for windbreaks. If you have enough space and want to add a sense of formal dignity to your landscape, the Norway spruce will suit you well. **DECIDUOUS TREES Bur Oak** (Quercus macrocarpa) A versatile member of the white oak family, the burr oak grows well in both wet and dry soils. This oak matures to the 70 - 80 feet range and can produce an impressive spread to its canopy. Its distinctive acorn gives this tree its Latin name being the largest acorn of our native oaks. The fringe of coarse fibers around the edge of the acorn cap gives this tree its common name. **Northern Red Oak** (*Quercus rubra*) The northern red oak has been called "one of the handsomest, cleanest, and stateliest trees in North America" by naturalist Joseph S. Illick, and it is widely considered a national treasure. It is especially valued for its adaptability and usefulness, including its hardiness in urban settings. This medium to large tree is also known for its brilliant fall color, great value to wildlife and status as the state tree of New Jersey. Whether you're selecting a tree to plant in your front yard or out on the farm, it's a fast-growing species worth keeping in mind. **Red Maple** (Acer rubrum) The native red maple is another one of those great four seasons tree. Its small red flowers are a real harbinger of spring and its silvery gray bark presents a nice contrast to the spring flowering bulbs. It spreading canopy makes this tree a perennial shade favorite and it fall colors are striking. As well, its gray bark and classic shape make it a winter standout. Like all the maples, the red maple is a heavy drinker so plant this one where you can give it weekly watering during dry periods.

| | Sweetgum (Liquidambar styraciflua) |

| | The sweetgum is a large native shade tree with outstanding autumn color. Fall foliage ranges from yellow to flaming red to purple – sometimes on the same tree. Though not as large as the previously described tulip tree, the sweetgum often reaches 60 to 75'. The bark on the twigs has interesting corky wings when mature. The sweetgum tree produce a round, spiny, "gum ball" shaped fruit that many people use in crafts. This is tree that prefers full sun and moist soils but easily tolerates partial shade and drier than ideal soil moisture. |
| | Sycamore (Platanus occidentalis) |
| | One of the tallest of the broad-leafed trees in our native Hoosier forests, the sycamore is easy to spot in the winter by its white trunk. Usually found growing along streams and in lowlands in the wild, the Sycamore has proven itself to be a widely adaptable tree in the home land-scape. Even if this tree wasn't a beautiful shade producer, its beautiful bark would be reason enough to place this one in your landscaping. |
| | Tulip Poplar (Liriodendron tulipifera) |
| | Every 4 th grader in Indiana learns that the tulip tree is our state tree. What generally isn't known is that the tulip poplar is not a true poplar but is, in fact, a member of the magnolia family. It also is one of the tallest and most beautiful trees in the eastern hardwood forest. This is a large tree, capable of reaching heights well in excess of 100'. It usually has a straight trunk and a rounded to spreading crown. The tulip tree blooms in May, producing many tulip-shaped flowers which can be difficult to see since it blooms after the tree leaf's out. |
| | SMALL TREES AND SHRUBS |
| 1. S. 18 | Eastern Redbud (Cercis canadensis) |
| | The Eastern Redbud is a small to medium tree with heart-shaped leaves. It is named for the many small pea-shaped flowers that cover the tree in the spring. It has a tendency to grow in clusters in the understory and presents one of the most beautiful springtime displays along the roadsides. As a landscape tree, it can be planted in a grouping or as a specimen tree. |
| the the | Paw Paw (Asminina trilobal) |
| | Let's go down yonder to the Pawpaw patch! Who doesn't know that old ditty? What you probably don't know is that the pawpaw is a member of a tropical family of trees that somehow got "stuck" in a temperate climate. A bit finicky to grow, the "Hoosier Banana" is worth the effort. As an understory plant, it wants dappled shade and plenty of moisture for best growth and fruit production. |
| | Red twig Dogwood (Cornus sericea) |
| | Redtwig Dogwood is a native shrub for all seasons. With a dense multi-stemmed structure as a base, oval green leaves cover its smooth green stems in the spring. Creamy white flower clusters in summer attract butterflies followed by creamy white berries that attract birds. In autumn, the stems and foliage turn red with the stem color lasting through the winter giving the plant its name. There are few things in the winter landscape as cheery as seeing this plant poking up through the snow! |
| | Witch-hazel (Hamamelis virginiana) |
| | There's nothing sinister about this small native tree. It's name comes from the middle English word, wiche, meaning bendable. It's pliant forked branches often produced just the shaped branches that the early settlers sought for locating underground water sources. From a landscaping standpoint, the witch-hazel makes an interesting statement with its somewhat twisted shape and small yellow flowers that it produces in the autumn rather than spring. |
